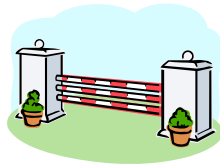
Email Database

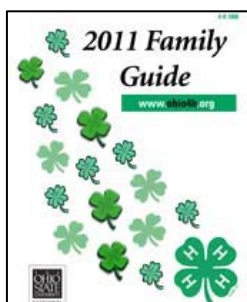

2011 State 4-H Ambassador Applications Due February 7

Just a reminder that 2011 Ohio 4-H Ambassador Applications are being accepted now through February 7 (the Ohio 4-H Professionals Winter In-Service date). They are available through the links on the 4-H Ambassadors webpage at <http://www.ohio4h.org/youth/ambassadors/index.html>

All Ohio 4-H'ers are eligible who: a) are a high school freshman, sophomore, junior or senior on January 1 of the current year; b) verify on the application form that they have achieved 25 points in relation to each of the six standards of excellence used as criteria for the program; c) are approved by their 4-H Educator as good representatives of the Ohio 4-H Program, d) have a permanent residence in Ohio during the time they wish to serve as Ambassadors; and e) have not previously been a State 4-H Ambassador.

Ambassadors are the youth spokespersons for Ohio 4-H. They have many tremendous opportunities open to them as Ambassadors, and provide leadership in state and local 4-H programs across the state during their year of active service. If you have 4-H teens that would be good State 4-H Ambassadors, please encourage them to apply. All 4-H teens who meet the minimum required Standards of Excellence and are approved by their 4-H Educator as good representatives of the Ohio 4-H Youth Development Program will be invited to become State 4-H Ambassadors and to participate in the March 12 Ambassador Orientation at Ohio 4-H Teen Conference. Ohio 4-H Achievement Records & Scholarship Applications

The Ohio 4-H Achievement Record & Ohio 4-H Scholarship Application are forms used by 4-H members age 14 (as of 1/1/11) and older to apply for trips, awards, and scholarships. The reports are a participation record of all activities, honors, projects taken, offices held, etc. that the 4-H member has been involved in during their 4-H career. 4-H members of all ages are encouraged to complete the record each year so that when they do reach age 14, all of the information will already be compiled for easy completion.

Members filling out the 2011 Achievement Record can be selected to receive an all expense paid trip to Citizenship Washington Focus, Ohio 4-H Sea Camp, 4-H Leadership Camp, Forestry Camp, Buckeye Leadership Workshop, Carving New Ideas Workshop, or the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia. Most of these trips are sponsored by the Franklin County 4-H Council.

One person in the state of Ohio will be selected in each of the National 4-H Congress / State Achievement Award Areas. Those selected will represent the state at the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia in November of 2011. To be considered for these awards, one nominee and one alternate will be selected in each of the categories at the county level and sent on for state selections.

4-H members are strongly encouraged to take the time to apply for these very prestigious awards. Pay close attention to the instructions as the review committee takes points off for not following the instructions. Achievement Record Opportunities



Citizenship Washington Focus – July 3-9, 2011; Approximate Value: \$975

This trip is a 4-H leadership program for high school youth, ages 15-19, from across the country. CWF helps youth understand how their individual actions can make a difference in our world. The programs use our nation's capital as a classroom to foster youth appreciation, understanding and involvement in civic responsibility, government operations and current issues.

Ohio 4-H Leadership Camp – August 10-14, 2011; Approximate Value: \$230

This camp is a once-in-a-lifetime, exciting, fun, challenging, in-depth, leadership development experience. It is one of the best programs of its kind in the nation. Leadership Campers plan, conduct, and evaluate the program themselves! In addition, this year's camp will be better than ever with some of our state's top government officials, business leaders, educational leaders, civic leaders, and recreation leaders being on hand during the week to provide excellent leadership presentations and "learn by doing" leadership sessions. Leadership Camp is held at 4-H Camp Ohio, in Utica.

Ohio 4-H Sea Camp – July 9-13, 2011; Approximate Value: \$425

This camp is open to youth ages 13-18 (as of Jan. 1, 2011). The goal of the camp is to acquaint 4-H youth with one of Ohio's most important resources: Lake Erie!! You will "get your feet wet" while you learn marine-related skills, crafts and activities. Sea Camp is held at Kelley's Island 4-H Camp on beautiful Lake Erie.



Forestry & Wildlife Conservation Camp – June 12-17, 2011; Approx. Value: \$300

Have you ever wondered what types of trees are in Ohio's forests? Or what kinds of relationships organisms have with the forest? If so, Ohio Forestry & Wildlife Conservation Camp is the place to be! Camp is held at FFA Camp Muskingum, which is situated on Leesville Lake in the beautiful rolling hills of Carroll County. Any student who has completed 8th grade and is at least fifteen (15) years of age is welcome to participate. Be prepared to obtain valuable forestry information, make many new friends and HAVE FUN!!!



Ohio 4-H Shooting Sports Education Camp – July 10-15, 2011; Approx. Value: \$280

This camp is a six day, fun-filled learning experience for youth, ages 12 to 18. The activities planned are part of the camp program focusing on the safe, responsible, ethical use of firearms and archery equipment. Shooting instruction is led by trained, experienced 4-H Shooting Sports Instructors. Each camper selects one shooting discipline as a specialty for the week. The majority of their shooting activities will be in this area (approximately 15 hours). Campers will also have the opportunity to sample additional shooting specialties. Shooting Education Camp is held at Canter's Cave 4-H Camp in Jackson, Ohio.



Buckeye Leadership Workshop – March 23-27, 2011; Approximate Value: \$360

Buckeye Leadership Workshop is a learning, sharing "workshop" designed as a balanced program of social, physical, mental, and spiritual activities. Participants are encouraged and empowered to experiment with new activities, develop new abilities, discover new interests, expand their creativity, practice and master new leadership skills, share ideas and personal skills, establish new friendships, and develop networks of human resources. This workshop is open to youth and adults ages 16 and older, and is held at Recreation Unlimited in Ashley, Ohio.
